URPE at ASSA is a group of URPE-organized sessions within the annual January meetings of the Allied Social Science Associations (commonly known as the American Economic Association meeting). The URPE presence at the ASSA meetings was established in the late 1960s when radical political economists protested at the business meeting of the Association and demanded that a place be made for heterodox economics.
